PUMPKIN SPICE LATTE RECIPE

Total Time: 5-10 Minutes | Serves: 1-2

INGREDIENTS

- ▶ 1 cup coconut milk
- ▶ 2 tbsp cooked pumpkin
- ▶ 1 tbsp maple syrup
- ▶ 1/4 tsp pumpkin pie spice
- ▶ 1/4 tsp vanilla extract
- ▶ 1/4 cup organic brewed coffee or espresso

DIRECTIONS

- 1** Combine the coconut milk, pumpkin, maple syrup, pumpkin pie spice and vanilla in a small pan over medium heat until the milk is hot.
- 2** Whisk vigorously to get the milk foamy for about 30 seconds.

To make your own pumpkin spice mix, combine:

- 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/8 teaspoon ground ginger
- pinch of ground nutmeg
- pinch of ground cloves or allspice

You'll only need a 1/4 teaspoon of this mix for the recipe below, but if you make two servings, you can use all of it
